THE GREAT GAME DIRECTOR: ANDREAS DALSGAARD

As part of the EYE & MIND SEMINAR series, director Andreas Dalsgaard will present his most recent feature documentary film 'The Great Game' (2018) and discuss his approach to filmmaking informed by his background in anthropology.

'The Great Game' is a family chronicle, an epic work and not least a film about fathers and sons in a family that is more adventurous than usual.

Michael and his father, the former Lord Chamberlain Søren Haslund-Christensen, are in the attic to find hidden treasures from the past. Michael's grandfather Henning was a famous explorer and collector of cultural heritage from Mongolian tribes, and Michael has heard rumours that Henning lived a double life as a British agent and arms smuggler. Now he wants to find out if this is true.
